**32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time**

**Luke 20:27-38**

Mr. X is an unbeliever of the afterlife. He participates in sinful worldly activities. His theory is to make the most of his present life for when dies his life will end.

He eventually died and chose to go to the pearly gates. He was met by a bearded man wearing a long white robe. He told him that he was not welcome. He then was snatched and taken to hell by a grim looking beast.

The gospel for this Sunday speaks about the Sadducee's who denies that there is an afterlife. He asked Jesus about a woman who married seven brothers to whose wife will she be in the resurrection?

Jesus said to them, "The children of this age remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels." They are the children of God who will rise.

In the resurrection the situation will be different. Here on earth we marry and procreate to sustain the inventory of life. In heaven relationships will not be like that. There will be no more marriage. We shall be like angels who will only worship God and no one else.

**6th Grade Confirmation Prep** will begin on December 4 from 6-7:30pm in the hall.

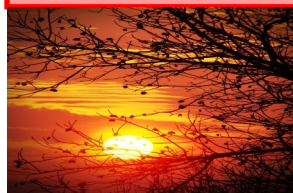
**7th and 8th Grade Confirmation Prep.** will meet this Sunday evening, Nov 6, from 6-7:30pm in the hall.
