**Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Matthew 10:26-33**

A man had trepidation as to whether he could share his reflections about the word of God via the internet.

He was apprehensive as to his personal intellectual inadequacy and his very shallow vocabulary of the English language.

Amidst his limitations and apprehensions he proceeded to write his simple reflections. Almost ten years later, the man who was fearful of his intellectual shortcomings is still writing his simple reflection on the daily Gospel.

In this Sunday's Gospel Jesus tells to fear no one. This is an encompassing advice from Jesus to not fear speaking or writing for Jesus. If we let fear into our hearts it will paralyze us. Why do we fear if we have faith in Jesus? Why fear when Jesus is telling us to share what we know about Him and to share it with humility?

The Apostles did not let fear defeat them for they knew that even if though there was no physical manifestation of Jesus' presence, there was always the presence of His spiritual and sacramental manifestation before them.

Jesus calls us all to share his Will and He will make us adequate. If we feel half empty, He will fill us until we overflow. If we are fearful, He will make us courageous. What He only wants from us is to learn to trust Him for He will equip us with anything that we need.

Elements of the Mass

Episode 31: The Dismissal

We might consider that the words of the dismissal are the three (*Ite, missa est*) most forgotten words of the entire Mass. The Latin word, "Ite" is the imperative of "go". This is an emphatic, insistent Go! "*Ite, missa est*" literally means "Go, it is sent." Mass was originally a series of dismissals: the dismissal of those in the Order of Penitents, the dismissal of those in the Order of Catechumen, and finally, at the end of Mass, the dismissal of the members of the community of the Faithful. The Church herself teaches what we are to do at the dismissal of the Mass: we must return to doing good works, and praising and blessing God. The new edition of the Roman Missal provides four options for the dismissal:

- 1) Go forth, the Mass is ended;
- 2) Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord;
- 3) Go in peace glorifying the Lord by your life;
- 4) Go in peace

The second and third dismissals were added to the Roman Missal by Pope Benedict XVI in response to the 2008 Synod on the Word of God in the Life and Mission of the Church. The Holy Father added these biblical dismissals so that the connection between liturgy and daily life would be more evident. The first of these comes from the story of healing of the demoniac in the gospel of Saint Mark. The other comes from the fifth chapter of Saint Luke which describes the healing of the paralytic. He went home glorifying God! We are reminded at the conclusion of every Mass that the Mission of the Catholic Faithful is precisely to bring the message of the Gospel to their families, to their neighborhoods and to the workplace.

This is the final episode. We hope that you have enjoyed learning more about the Elements of the Mass.
