- Knights of Columbus/Holy Name Society Provide • Altar Servers - Assist the priest in preparing for Mass. The servers take part in the liturgy by performing tasks to charitable service to the poor and hungry, while help the priest celebrate Eucharist. promoting Catholic education and family values.
- Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion Assist the priest by distributing the Eucharist at Mass.
- Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to the Sick - Assist the priest by taking Eucharist to the sick whether they are at home, a personal care home or a nursing home.
- Greeters Welcome and greet people as they enter the front door of the church.
