April 14, 2024 Third Sunday of Easter – Year B Acts 3:13-15, 17-19; Psalms 4:2, 4, 7-9 1 John 2:1-5; Luke 24:35-48 CHRIST IS THE FIRST EXEGETE

Understanding the Scriptures does not mean opening the Bible and finding there specific

texts referring to the Suffering of the Messiah. For sure, there is a wealth of scriptural allusions to

the suffering of people who were "men of God," chief among them the Suffering Servant of God.

But these remain to be allusions, not forthright texts. This explains why no one in Israel thought

of the Messiah as suffering; on the contrary, the Messiah was expected to be a glorious figure who would restore the "fallen hut" of King David.

By "Scriptures" we will have to understand the whole of Scriptures (the Old Testament,

i.e., "the Law of Moses," "prophets and psalms" as containing the will and the plan of God. That

Jesus as the Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead "according to Scriptures" is all part of

God's plan. This means that His death on the cross is not a mere coincidence; it belongs to the

context of God's ongoing plan to save His people. Jesus' death is not the consequence of human

pride and machinations, but the fulfillment of love that achieves reconciliation with God.

In the light of this insight from the Risen Lord and of their understanding that the Jesus-

event is the climax of God's ongoing relationship with human beings, it comes natural for believers

to see that "Christ is the fulfillment of Scriptures." He is the Logos-Wisdom from which the words

of Scriptures proceed and to which they return. He is the Word which is expressed "in other words"

of Scriptures. Saint Paul also states that Jesus Christ died for our sins "in accordance with the

scriptures." The apostle thus relates Jesus' death and resurrection to salvation history, to the history

of God's covenant with the people of Israel. Salvation history derives its logic and true meaning

in the death and resurrection of Christ. The Paschal Mystery of Christ is in accordance with the

Sacred Scriptures and its Scriptures' deepest fulfillment.

Jesus is the recapitulation of God's dealings with men and women in order to lead them back

to Himself. For believers, Scriptures

(Old Testament) without Jesus Christ or outside of Him is without a Logos, an inner logic. Jesus

Christ, the incarnate Word (Logos) is precisely that.

"Beginning with Moses and all the prophets, He interpreted to them what referred to Him

in all the scriptures. Pope Francis explains, "Christ is the first exegete! Not only did the Old

Testament foretell what He would accomplish, but He Himself wished to be faithful to its words, in order to make manifest the one history of salvation whose fulfilment is found in Christ" (Asperuit III,6)
