THE FIRST OF ALL THE COMMANDMENTS

Deuteronomy 6:2-6; Psalm 18:2-4, 47, 51
Hebrews 7:23-28; Mark 12:28-34

Unlike that of the others, the scribe's attitude in today's Gospel inspires us to imitate him. He comes to Jesus with an open mind and heart, observing with docility what Jesus is doing and teaching. In the end, both he and Jesus concur on the point that to love God and one's neighbor is first and foremost and is above any form of sacrificial offerings. While the said scribe is not formally a disciple of Jesus, he is, by heart and mind, because he is docile and willing to learn from the Master. Indeed, it is a graced experience when two people open up to each other rather than close themselves in or even suspect each other. Both learn from each other and are mutually enriched. All friendships begin in this way.

For Pope Francis, the love of God and the love of neighbor are two faces of the same coin. He says, "Jesus taught once and for all that love for God and love for one's neighbor are inseparable; indeed, more than that, they support each other. Even if placed in sequence, they are the two faces of a single coin: lived together they are the true strength of the believer! To love God is to live by him and for him, for what he is and for what he does. It means to invest one's energies every day to be his collaborators in serving our neighbor without reserve, in trying to forgive without limits and in cultivating relationships of communion and fraternity" (Angelus, 4 November 2008).
