From the Desk of the Administrator

As I mentioned last week, the month of June has been filled with a variety of liturgical observances that are of the highest rank of feast in the life of the Church, known as "Solemnities." This year, we are privileged to celebrate on a Sunday the Solemnity of the Apostles Saints Peter and Paul, who are known as the two great pillars of the faith. Peter who was given the authority of the keys, and Paul, the great teacher of the Gentiles, are honored together on this day for their respective roles in building up the early Church and for their ultimate witness of martyrdom.

According to tradition, this is the day on which the Holy Father blesses the new "pallia" which are taken from the tomb of Peter directly beneath the Altar of the Confession (the Papal altar) in St. Peter's Basilica and imposes them on the shoulders of the new Metropolitan Archbishops that have been appointed over the past year. The *pallium* is a small white garment made of wool with five black crosses and three pins worn around the neck over the chasuble during the celebration of Mass by the Metropolitans throughout the world as a sign of their jurisdiction over the other dioceses within their ecclesiastical Province.

This Friday, our nation celebrates Independence Day, in which we give thanks for the many gifts and blessings the Lord has bestowed upon us, and the freedom and protection that we can so often take for granted. We also acknowledge those ways in which we still need to grow and become less independent from God and how he desires us to live as a people united in a common mission and purpose to do our part in bringing about true justice and peace in a land that so desperately needs it.

As we enter once again into the Sundays of Ordinary Time during the heart of the summer, may all that we have celebrated throughout this past month be an opportunity to enter into the life of God, who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and the witness of his saints who live for ever to intercede for us on our pilgrimage through life, on our journey to heaven. *To Jesus Christ, who was, who is, and who is to come, Lord of time and history, be endless praise, for ever and ever!*

I am looking forward to being here at St. Patrick to celebrate Masses next weekend (July 5/6), and to meet as many of you as possible. Again, I am grateful to Fr. Alan for serving the day-to-day pastoral and spiritual needs of the parish, while I am tasked of taking care of the administrative duties.


